Homily Exaltation of the Holy Cross

Brothers and sisters, today the Church lifts high the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ—not as a sign of shame, but as the very throne of His glory. In the Gospel, Jesus tells Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life."

The Cross is the paradox of our faith: an instrument of death that has become the tree of life. On Calvary, humanity's sin and despair were nailed to the wood, and from that same wood flowed forgiveness, mercy, and salvation. Saint John Paul II once said: "The Cross is the school of love." It teaches us that God's love is not abstract; it is love willing to embrace suffering to save the beloved.

Saint Paul reminds us: "We preach Christ crucified" (1 Cor 1:23). To exalt the Cross means to recognize in it our hope, our healing, and our victory. When we trace the sign of the Cross on ourselves, we are not making a mere gesture, we are professing that our lives belong to the One who loved us unto death.

As we celebrate this feast, let us ask the Lord to make us faithful witnesses of the Cross in our daily lives. May we embrace our difficulties with trust, unite them to Christ's sacrifice, and allow His victory to shine through us.

"We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world."
